* Referring/existing customer must: have a checking, savings, or money market account at BankFinancial to be eligible for the reward, and will receive \$100 deposited into their BankFinancial account within 30 days after the qualifying account opening. New customer/friend (Referral) must: present the referral form when opening a new personal checking account (excludes money market and student checking accounts), and must be a new customer to BankFinancial or have not had an account within the last 6 months. Account must meet minimum balance opening requirements and is subject to approval. Minimum deposit to open: Everyday and e-Rewards = \$100, Spectrum Checking = \$2,500, Lifeline Checking = \$50. To qualify for \$100, new customer account must have at least one ACH transaction of \$250 or greater or complete 10 PIN or signature based debit card transactions of \$10 or more that post and clear within the first two full statement cycles. New/referred customer will receive the \$100 deposited into their account 90 days after the qualifying account is opened and behaviors are met so long as the account is in good standing. New customer acknowledges the referral payment to the referring friend will disclose that the new customer opened an account. Charity organization will receive \$100 within 60 days after the new customer account has met the qualifying behaviors. Rewards are reportable on IRS Form 1099.
